{King David} subdued: ¹² Edom and Moab, the Ammonites and the Philistines, and Amalek. He also dedicated the plunder taken from Hadadezer. . . king of Zobah. ¹³ And David became famous after he returned from striking down . . . Edomites



2 Samuel 11: 1-5

In the spring, at the time when kings go off to war, David sent Joab out with the king's men and the whole Israelite army. . . But David remained in Jerusalem.

² One evening David got up from his bed and walked around on the roof of the palace. From the roof he saw a woman bathing. The woman was very beautiful, ³ and David sent someone to find out about her. The man said, "She is Bathsheba, the daughter of Eliam and the wife of

Uriah the Hittite." ⁴ Then David sent messengers to get her. She came to him, and he slept with her. . . Then she went back home.
